Turtle study resumes in Little Long Pond

Dr. Donald Padgett, Professor of Biological Sciences at Bridgewater State University, will resume his study of the turtle community in Little Long Pond later this summer. Dr. Padgett is a botanist with a special focus on freshwater aquatic ecosystems. His bi-yearly study of Little Long Pond study (which skipped 2021) will once again focus the abundance of the invasive red-eared sliders relative to the native painted turtles and redbellied cooters. Dr. Padgett has secured the required permits for his work from the Massachusetts Division of Fish and Wildlife. He asks if you see his turtle traps (hoop-nets and floating cages) that you please do not disturb them. If left alone, they do not harm the turtles in any way. Thanks to Six Ponds member Kit Warren again for providing Dr. Padgett with the use of her pondfront for access and equipment storage.

Spring Clean Up Day

This year's spring Clean Up day on May 7 featured a special collection of "nips" (typically 50ml liquor bottles) that were segregated from the other collected trash. Plymouth's Clean Up Day coordinator Patrick Farah has created a handy <u>map</u> depicting the locations and quantities of nips collected in our region. A total of 4,469 nips were collected.

Several cities and towns in Massachusetts, including Newton and Wareham, have banned the sale of liquor in nips (defined as bottles with a volume of less than 100ml). With two years of data on nips, it is becoming apparent that this is a persistent problem in Plymouth, and one which should be addressed by regulation. If Plymouth and adjacent towns act wisely, we may see a decrease in one of the major components of

roadside litter. Stay tuned for updates on this issue.
