The webinar will provide **an introduction to Freshwater Pond Science**, helping us understand the basic biological, chemical, and physical processes that govern these important ecosystems. By understanding pond ecology, the biodiversity of aquatic life in our ponds, cyanobacteria, and the impacts of human activities, we will be more effective in protecting our ponds. The webinar will:

She is also a member of the Cape Cod Commission team that is guiding the Freshwater Ponds Initiative. Liz has worked on multiple pond assessment and restoration projects across the Cape.
